

Clatskanie Library Buck-A-Book Sale

The Friends of the Clatskanie Library held their annual Buck-A-Book Sale on Thursday, August 2nd and Friday, August 3rd, 2012 from 10:00am – 5:00pm. On Saturday, August 4th, the sale concluded with a Buck-A-Bag (or Box) blow out sale from 10:00am – 3:00pm. Located at 11 Lillich Street, the library had books available that spanned across several genres including children’s books, self-help, historical, fiction and non-fiction alike. The sale was held in the park across the street from the library with free lemonade provided to visitors and shoppers.

The goal of the book sale was to raise funding which will be used to target children and adult programs at the library. According to Ernie Carman, President of the Friends of the Clatskanie Library, “The Friends also maintain and pay for all grounds keeping outside the library including the library's mini-park across the street where the Friends installed the Raymond Carver Memorial and planted the "Liberty Tree" and Empress tree along the river. This is done as a relief to the Clatskanie Library District that has an elected board and a regular tax levy that pays for what goes on inside of the library.”
