

Caples House Harvest Festival

The Caples House Museum, owned and maintained by the Oregon State Society of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, held its annual Harvest Festival on Saturday, October 13.

The Caples House Museum, located in Columbia City, Oregon, sits on a hillside above the Columbia River and is the historic home of the Caples Family. Extensions of the museum include a tool shed, a Country Store, Knapp Center, and Children's Attic. In addition to its annual Harvest Festival, the Caples House is available for weddings, retreats, conferences, and parties. The Caples House also hosts Tea and Sweets each Friday from 2:00pm – 4:00pm for \$5.00 per person.

Those who attended the Harvest Festival enjoyed many activities presented throughout the day including candle and cider making along with old-fashioned games hosted by the Rainier Junior/Senior High School History Club. Additionally, visitors were able to enjoy lunch inside the museum for a charge, and the museum store was open for visitors to peruse and purchase items. Additionally, horse and carriage rides were offered to those who attended for no cost with donations gladly accepted.
